The Third Letter of John is about how the Gospel changes our welcome of strangers.

The Gospel lived out...

- _____ effort to care for the stranger no matter how long they stay (vs5-6).
- _____ opportunities to support the stranger by affirming their gifts (vs7-8).
- _____ the needs of the stranger and speaks well of them (vs9-11).

Connecting this to my life as a believer in the Gospel:

- Put yourself in their experience, welcoming him/her as you would want to be welcomed.
- See him/her as valuable, having gifts and potential to build up you and others.
- Be a "Gaius" and not a "Diotrephes" to the stranger among you.
